
Long-term Care Companies Sought for Industry Panel

Millions of Dollars in Earned Income Tax Credits are Unclaimed Each Year

A Department of Commerce news release says many people are eligible for a tax refund of up to \$6,269 from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and do not claim it.

Last year 436,000 people in Washington applied for the credit, yet an estimated \$270 million in federal tax credits went unclaimed.

Free tax preparation services are available to low- and moderate-income families. Call 2-1-1 and ask for "free tax preparation locations" or search "free tax prep" at www.irs.gov.
