Part-time and summer jobs are not available for many youth, so it's important to expose them to jobs and career options in other ways. WorkSource's Youth Business Services Coordinator, Lance Carter, (photo at left) partners with companies to develop learning opportunities for young adults ages 16 to 24 to help them gain exposure to local industries and develop the skills necessary to succeed in today's workforce.

Businesses can partner with WorkSource to provide internships, job shadowing, company tours and/or summer employment opportunities for young people. WorkSource is also looking for individuals to speak to school classes, be mentors and/or conduct mock interviews.

South Kelso Homes Sought for Youth Construction Training Program



The South Kelso Neighborhood Association, in partnership with the Southwest Washington Workforce Development Council, City of Kelso, Cowlitz County, Lower Columbia CAP, Goodwill, ESD112 and others, is seeking South Kelso homes in need of repair for a youth workforce training program.

The group is looking for homes in need of rehabilitation (i.e., new roof, weatherization and/or other structural problems, seniors and individuals with disabilities needing accessibility ramps, etc.) that can be worked on by local youth as a way to develop their construction skills and aid South Kelso neighbors in need.

Home owners in the South Kelso neighborhood that have significant home repairs that are beyond their means and ability to fix should call 360-425-3430, ext. 207 and leave a detailed message that includes: their full name, address of the proposed site, phone number and email, length of residency at the project location, reason for need and type of assistance needed.

The project is funded through SWWDC and community partners as part of its youth workforce preparation program and there are no costs to home owners. Property to be rehabilitated must be occupied by the owner.

If you work with students interested in pursuing a degree in the fields of science, technology, engineering, mathematics or health care, encourage them to apply for the Washington State Opportunity



Scholarship to receive up to \$22,500 in funding and additional professional development support.

Applicant must be a Washington state resident with a GED or high school diploma from a Washington high school or institution and pursuing first bachelor's degree in a STEM or health care field at a college or university in Washington State.
