NEXT Success youth career and employment center takes its next step
New central and community-based locations coming

Vancouver, Wash. (May 2, 2025) — [NEXT Success](#) (formerly NEXT) is moving its headquarters to Partners in Careers, 3210 NE 52nd Street, Vancouver, WA 98663, effective May 19, 2025.

The career and employment center for young adults ages 16 to 24 was launched by [Workforce Southwest Washington](#) in 2018. It has provided more than 1,000 young adults with education services, job preparation and training, internships, GED tutoring and testing, and more.

Services will be available at the Partners in Careers location beginning May 19. Monday through Thursday services will be available from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., both in person and remotely (virtually). On Fridays, services will be virtual only. Attending an orientation is a recommended first step, and registration is through the website www.nextsuccess.org.

The move is part of a strategic effort to enhance youth employment services by embedding them more deeply within the community. NEXT Success services will be available at Fourth Plain Community Commons in late May. New co-locations in Battle Ground, La Center and Washougal are anticipated this fall. Services are also available, by appointment, in Cowlitz and Wahkiakum counties.

The current NEXT Success location at 120 NE 136th Avenue, Suite 130, Vancouver, WA 98684 will close on May 8.
