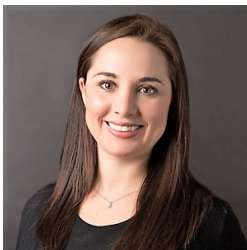
Workforce Southwest Washington Announces New Board Officers
